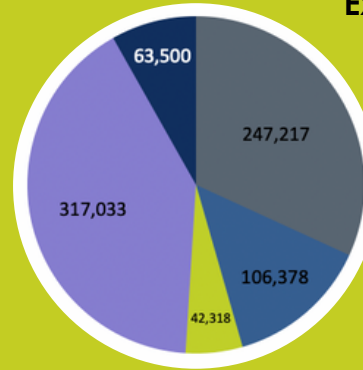

THE YEAR'S HAPPENINGS

September 2022 - August 2023

- > CrossRoads Students Impact Weekend: Spiritual growth event. Partnered with eight area churches.
- < Church-wide 21 Days of Prayer: Covered areas of prayer together (Aug./Jan.)
- > Beth Shalom Conference: Monte and Hugh Bromiley trained 80 attendees. Beth Shalom Conference in San Marcos, TX: 19 attendees from CrossRoads.
- < Held our annual church-wide CrossRoads Christmas Party w/excellent attendance.
- > Exceeded our goal of 180 Orphan Relief and Rescue Christmas Bundles by 95, making a total of 275 sent to ORR in West Africa.
- < Super Bowl Party and Chili Cook-off: Gathered to watch the game, eat and fellowship.
- > Wild Game Dinner: Feasted on homemade dishes from the hunting season. Heard from one of our own, Stacy Byrd, leader of our Men's Group on Wednesdays.
- < IF: Gathering: a weekend to remind women of their commission to spread the gospel, while inspiring hope and creating community.
- > Belfast Coffeehouse fundraiser: Organized to raise money for Belfast Mission trip with coffeehouse menu items and a silent auction with a wide range of options available.
- < CrossRoads Students brought 40+ students to Summer Camp (Texas) and 10+ to be leaders at Lead Team Camp (Arkansas).

- < Belfast Mission Trip: Lead by Eric Foshee, with 7 attendees from CrossRoads and 3 from First Moss Bluff. This team did ministry and VBS like activities at local churches and schools.
- > KidStuf in the Bluff: A three-day event hosting more than 70 kids from the area with a theme of "Heaven on Earth."
- < Grow Conference: A three-day event in Birmingham, AL designed to empower leaders by giving them practical tools and resources for church growth. We were able to bring 3 staff members and 5 serve team members.



SERVE TEAM BASH

To honor and thank our 145 Serve Team Members, we held our second Serve Team Bash. It was Western themed accompanied with BBQ, photo station, inflatables, music and games. Smiles were big and bellies were full.

THEME FOR YEAR

Our focus this ministry year was bringing Heaven to earth. We incorporated this into KidStuf in the Bluff, Beth Shalom Training, our teaching series and our Jan. and Aug. 21 Days of Prayer. We will continue to equip the church with tools and resources to be able to make "Thy Kingdom come" a reality here in Moss Bluff.



BETH SHALOM TRAININGS

This year we had a twelve week course with 41 attendees from CrossRoads and other churches, developed and taught by Sharon Ardizzone. The training taught what Beth Shalom is and how to train others. Trainings were made available for all who weren't able to come to CrossRoads, including churches in Florida, Georgia and Oklahoma.
